**PUBLIC
PARTICIPATION:** Candi Smith said the house on 605 is about the same. Almendinger had called Health Dept. about
the trash and Dattilo had also called the Health Department.
Ron VanWinkle complimented the Trustees for the chip and seal job on Trenton Road. Justice
said that the company who did the chip and seal will be back to do a fog seal
application.
Glennis Dunfee from the Delaware County Health Department updated the Trustees on activities at
the Health Department. They have e-bikes safety sheets and on August 8 they are
having a Baby Expo. She reported that they will have a presentation on August 12 from
9 – 12:30 p regarding the health assessment results for Delaware County and a County
Trail Forum on Thurs., Oct. 1.

**BSTG FIRE
DEPARTMENT:** Fisher reported that 4 part-time firefighters resigned and they hired one part-time firefighter. BSTG
is in the middle of Union negotiations. Open house was cancelled on Friday because of legal
reasons. The current levy is 4.85 mils and they are proposing a 7.35 mils. The Chief or Greg Roy
will come to the meeting to explain the levy on the ballot.

**ZONING
INSPECTOR**

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- REPORT:** Dattilo reported that he has attended the Trustees, DRPC, and BZC in July and wrote 5 Zoning Certificates for a total of 41 for 2026. The Benningtons were in the audience and were applying for a detached ADU building for father. They are planning to close next week. Dattilo said he would take their application and talk to the prosecutor. If everything is correct and all information received, then the application will be accepted and will go before the BZA for a Hearing.
